

THE GOAL of the regional Housing Policy Plan is to create housing options that give people in all life stages and of all economic means viable choices for safe, stable, and affordable homes.

WHAT THE DATA SHOW

- Needs are growing
- People are paying too much of their income for housing
- Housing supply isn't growing as fast as demand

30% of AMI

\$24,850

annual income for a family of four

\$621

is an affordable monthly rent

Job examples: home health aide, funeral attendant

50% of AMI

\$41,450

annual income for a family of four

\$1,036

is an affordable monthly rent

Job examples: animal control workers, barbers

80% of AMI

\$63,900

annual income for a family of four

\$1,596

is an affordable monthly rent

Job examples: soil scientists, planners, police officers

AMI = Area Median Income


WHAT THE REGION CAN EXPECT IN 2040

Number of households in the region will grow by 391,000 or 34%.

The mix of household size will require more types of housing. Today, households of people 65 and older are about 17% of the population. In 2040, that number will nearly double to 33% of households in our region.

Nearly half (48%) of households will have incomes of less than 80% of the area median income, or \$63,900 for a family of four, meaning they will be in need of affordable housing.


HOUSEHOLD INCREASE AND HOUSEHOLDS BY AGE

- Expand housing choices in high-income areas
- Expand opportunity in low-income areas
- Encourage redevelopment and infill development
- Encourage mixed-income housing development
- Promote environmentally sustainable housing
