







Minneapolis Chain of Lakes Regional Park, Loon Lake Trolley Path, 1699 West 34th Street








Boundaries

Loon Lake Trolley Path

- 1.03-acres
- Narrow strip of land, used to be the route of a trolley line
- Averages 50 feet in width, considerable slope down to East Bde Maka Ska Parkway
- Currently owned by Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board

1699 West 34th Street

- 0.20-acre
- Unusually shaped parcel is surrounded by parkland and public right-of-way
- Generally level where house was previously located, considerable slope down to East Bde Maka Ska Parkway
- Currently in private ownership

Partner Engagement


- East Calhoun Community Organization (ECCO)

Development Concept

- Takes advantage of topography
- Includes overlooks, interpretation opportunities, and nature play nodes
- Soft-surface trail
- Enhance safety and access
 - Ground-level lightning
 - Wayfinding
- Habitat and view protection

Estimated Costs



- Loon Lake Trolley Path is currently owned by MPRB.
- The 2023 market value of the parcel at 1699 West 34th Street is \$926,000.
- The total estimated development cost is \$534,742.
- Together, the estimated acquisition and development costs are \$1,460,742.


Rationale for Proposed Action
